Privacy protection authorities to discuss findings of joint investigation into TikTok

VICTORIA - The privacy protection authorities for Canada, Québec, British Columbia and Alberta will hold a news conference to discuss the findings of an investigation into popular online video-sharing platform TikTok.

The joint investigation had a particular focus on TikTok's privacy practices as they relate to younger users, including whether the company obtained valid and meaningful consent from these users for the collection, use and disclosure of their personal information.

Participants at the press conference will include:
