Trust and transparency the focus of this year's Privacy Awareness Week

VICTORIA — The Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner for BC, along with members of the Asia Pacific Privacy Authorities (APPA), will observe Privacy Awareness Week from May 15-21. This year's theme, "Trust and Transparency," will be highlighted in OIPC promotional materials, events, and activities throughout the week.

"We wanted to take this opportunity to encourage businesses and public bodies to be transparent about the personal information they collect," explains Drew McArthur, Acting Information and Privacy Commissioner for BC. "Tell people upfront and in plain language why you're collecting their personal information and how you will use it. This will create and maintain trust with the citizens of BC."

When your personal information is requested by a business or public body – anything from your email address to your social insurance number – ask questions before giving it away. And take the time to read the fine print in privacy policies, adds McArthur. "You have the right to know why your personal information is being collected, how it will be used, and how it will be protected." Here are our Privacy Awareness Week activities:
